The Meeting was called to order by Chairman Potts at 10:15 A.M. An invocation was given by Deputy Clerk Glen Warren, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Commissioner Tim Seals.

APPEARANCE OF CITIZENS

David Seal – District 9 – Spoke in opposition to public funding for the Chamber of Commerce, requested a stipulation be placed on the funding provided to the Joint Economic Development Committee stating that the funding could not be funneled into the Chamber of Commerce, and requested that a recommendation be placed on the funding of the School Board requesting that certain documents be placed on their website for public viewing.

CALLED BUSINESS

The meeting was called for the items listed on the agenda and no other business could be debated.

BUDGET COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

1. RESOLUTION 2022-30 — Resolution making appropriations to non-profit charitable organizations of Jefferson County, Tennessee, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023. Resolution 2022-30 was moved for approval as a recommendation from the budget committee. Commissioner Scarlett moved to amend the Resolution by decreasing the BGCDV funding by the \$32,000 increase in light of their proposed ARPA funding. The amendment was seconded by Commissioner Kesterson. A Roll Call vote was taken, and the amendment failed 10-4 (in favor: Kesterson, Moore, Lowe, Byrd, Solomon, Bales, Scarlett, Coleman, Dockery, and Carmichael). Commissioner Scarlett moves to amend the Memorandum of Understanding with CARE that they must take in animals surrendered by animal control, citing circumstances where animal control was told the facility was full and couldn't accept animals, they brought in. He stated that if an animal was refused then funding from the County would stop. A second was provided by Commissioner Moore. SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Jefferson County, Tennessee, assembled in a regular session on the 18th day of July 2022, in Dandridge, Tennessee, that the amounts hereafter set out are hereby appropriated for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the various funds, departments, institutions, offices, and agencies of Jefferson County, Tennessee, during fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, according to the following schedule:

SECTION 1. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407, Tennessee Code Annotated. One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund. Revenue for Fund 189 will be 189-47180 Community Development in the amount of \$470,000.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any appropriations made by this resolution, which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute, is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the county shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures, which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division, or department of the county in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division, or department of the county. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office agency, institution, division, or department for the year ending June 30, 2023. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made to meet such additional appropriation.

Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, Tennessee Code Annotated.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse and be of no further effect at the end of the year at June 30, 2022.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all resolutions of the Board of County Commissioners of Jefferson County, Tennessee, which are in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

On June 21, 2022, the City Council of Jefferson City approved an increase of \$12,100.00 in their annual contribution to the Jefferson County Library Budget, beginning FY 2022-2023. The City's annual contribution will now become \$64,265.00 (\$52,165 + 12,100.00), effective July 1, 2022.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE "ZONING RESOLUTION OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE" BY DEFINING, PERMITTING, AND REGULATING CYRPTOCURENCY MINING FACILITIES IN THE I-3 ZONING DISTRICT OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Commissioners, in accordance with Section 13-7-105 of the <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, may amend the zoning "Zoning Resolution of Jefferson County, Tennessee"; and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Regional Planning Commission, Dandridge Regional Planning Commission, Jefferson City Regional Planning Commission, and White Pine Regional Planning Commission have reviewed and made recommendations regarding the proposed amendment of the "Zoning Resolution of Jefferson County, Tennessee."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Jefferson County, Tennessee:

Section 1. Article 5 is hereby amended by adding the following definitions:

<u>Cryptocurrency</u>. Cryptocurrency is a digital currency designed to work as a medium of exchange through a computer network that is not reliant on any central authority, such as a government or bank, to uphold or maintain it. (Wikipedia)

<u>Cryptocurrency Mining</u>. Cryptocurrency mining is the process of using specialized computer equipment in the process of creating new coins in the blockchain by solving complex computations.

- Section 2. Article 7, is hereby amended by adding Section 7.17. as follows.
- 7.17. <u>Development Standards for Cryptocurrency Mining Facilities</u> Cryptocurrency Mining Facilities shall meet the following requirements.
 - A. Minimum Lot Size. Minimum lot size is eight (8) acres.
- B. Written Assurance of Available Power. An official signed letter or similar written document from the power distributer is required in conjunction with the site plan. This letter/document shall assure that there is adequate available power for the Cryptocurrency mining facility.
- C. Site Requirements. The site must be accessible by emergency vehicles and the company is responsible for providing necessary access, water, wastewater, energy and other needed services or facilities for its safe operation.

- D. Site Plan Requirement. A site plan is required for any proposed Cryptocurrency Mining Facilities prior to the beginning of construction, in accordance with Section 6.6.
- E. Building Setback Requirements. All buildings or facilities housing Cryptocurrency mining and related activities shall be set back from property lines a minimum of four hundred (400) feet.
- F. Maximum Sound Level. The sound level may not exceed sixty (60) decibels at the property lines. Excess sound mitigation may be necessary to achieve this requirement.
- G. Surety for Site Cleanup. A bond or other surety acceptable to the planning commission is required to ensure cleanup of the site once operations cease. The amount of the surety shall be based on a legitimate bid or estimate to remove all facilities and equipment from the site. Driveways and similar improvements may remain at the discretion of the planning commission.
- H. Disposal of Debris/Equipment/Materials. The disposal of computers, equipment, building materials, and other debris shall go to a landfill or similar operation outside of Jefferson County.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Commissioners, in accordance with Section 13-7-105 of the <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, may amend the zoning "Zoning Resolution of Jefferson County, Tennessee"; and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Regional Planning Commission, Dandridge Regional Planning Commission, Jefferson City Regional Planning Commission, and White Pine Regional Planning Commission have reviewed and made recommendations regarding the proposed amendment of the "Zoning Resolution of Jefferson County, Tennessee."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Jefferson County, Tennessee:

Section 1. Article 9.1. is hereby amended by adding the following:

A-2, Agricultural-Forestry-Food Processing District. Forty thousand (40,000) square feet except those properties with food processing buildings and uses shall be a minimum of five (5) acres.

Section 2. Article 9 is hereby amended by adding the following:

9.12. <u>Agricultural-Forestry-Food Processing District, A-2</u>. The intent of this district to designate rural areas for agricultural, forestry, and food processing activities; low density rural residential uses; and convenience activities primarily designed to serve area residents. To achieve the intent of this district, the permitted uses and structures are identified in section A.

A. Permitted Uses:

- 1. Any use permitted in the A-1 Agricultural-Forestry District subject to any conditions that may be required.
- 2. Food processing activities in accordance with Section 7.17 of this resolution.
- 3. Food processing activities may have more than one (1) principal building in conjunction with food processing and retail or wholesale trade of products processed on site.

B. <u>Uses Prohibited</u>. Uses not specifically noted above, unless the Jefferson County Board of Zoning Appeals deems a proposed use to be within the intent of the district and similar to a use listed above.

Section 3. Article 7 is hereby amended by adding the following section.

7.17. <u>Development Standards for Food Processing Activities.</u> The following regulations apply to food processing activities.

Food processing includes preparation of ice cream, cheese, salsa, and other products made or derived from milk, wheat, corn, sunflowers, oats, fruits, vegetables, and similar agricultural materials; and meat processing involving twenty-one (21) to one hundred (100) animal units per week (as defined in Section 7.16).

- A. The minimum lot size for any food processing development in the A-2 district is five (5) acres.
- B. The required building setback distances are: Front 75 feet; Side and Rear 125 feet.
- C. Food processing developments must be served by a road that meets county standards or is brought up to county standards.
- D. A site plan meeting the requirements of Section 6.6. is required for planning commission review and approval.
- E. Landscaping using berms and/or natural or planned vegetation may be required by the planning commission to lessen the visual impact of buildings.
- F. Parking and associated facilities shall meet the requirements of Section 6.8. except that the surface may be gravel.
- G. All applicable permits must be obtained.

Section 4. Article 9, Section 9.9.A. is hereby amended by adding the following subsection:

19. Meat Processing and Meat Processing Facilities.
